### Winterstoke bridge repair



Repairs to Winterstoke Road Bridge are expected to begin in 2022.

As you may know the Winterstoke Road bridge is in poor condition and has had a weight restriction of 7.5 tonnes in place since 2018. The bridge is owned by the MOD (dating back to the second world war) and North Somerset Council has

reached an agreement that the £14 million cost of replacing the bridge will be met by the MOD.

This is a vital road for the ward so I am pleased we have reached this milestone. Construction is expected to begin in 2022.

## **HOSPITAL A&E CHANGES GO AHEAD**



One of the protests I attended before speaking at the health meeting asking for the A&E decision to be referred to the Secretary of State.

In October the council's health panel met and voted through the Clinical Commissioning Group's proposal which included making the overnight closure of our A&E permanent.

Residents have continuously expressed concern about the proposed changes, which I share.

Alongside attending numerous protests I also spoke at the health panel arguing that they should reject the proposal because it isn't in the public interest, it fails to consider the

benefits of a merger and the evidence of recruiting the GPs needed to support the service is weak.

I urged the panel to seek immediate Government intervention by referring the plans to the Secretary of State. However, the panel voted against this.

I'm disappointed with the decision but I can assure residents I will continue to campaign for a 24hr A&E. I will also closely monitor the impact of the changes and hold the CCG to account.

# Tackling Weston Village's and Locking Castle's dangerous roads

The roads around Weston Village and Locking Castle are in an unacceptable state and many areas of bricked-based roads are beginning to become dangerously loose. This issue has been going on for years and the council have taken a sticking plaster approach of small patch work repairs, rather than resurfacing the roads.

We need a long-term solution to these roads and the affected areas need to be completely resurfaced! I've walked around the ward taking pictures of the disrepair and mapped the affected areas.

I've submitted this evidence to the council and discussed with the councillor responsible for highways that the roads must be resurfaced and made safe. I've been assured the council are looking into this and I will have further news before the end of the financial year.

Over the last couple of months residents have been getting in touch about areas of the ward that were in dire need of a trim. There have been pavements with weeds growing out, trees and hedges that needed cutting, and leaves that needed clearing up. I've been continually raising this with the council and had driven around with a member of their team pointing out the areas that needed to be sorted.

I'm pleased to say much of the work appears to have now been done, although there are still some areas to do. I'll keep monitoring progress but if you see areas in need of a trim please let me know.



### Dirt bikes causing nuisance near Haywood Village

I'm aware bikers have been causing a nuisance on the old airfield as they use it as an off-road trail. Typically these bikes are very loud and often drive through Haywood Village at speed.

Residents from Hutton, Locking and Haywood Village have raised complaints to North Somerset Council, police and Persimmon Homes about this issue. The land is owned by Persimmon and they have agreed to put up signage making it clear that this behaviour is prohibited so police can enforce this when it occurs.

The advice I have received from authorities is that residents should report the antisocial behaviour to the police when it happens by calling 101, and if possible providing a vehicle registration number.

I'm hoping as the police begin to enforce this that the frequency of dirt bikes using the airfield reduces. If the situation doesn't change or action doesn't appear to be happening please get in

In 2015 we were all promised that Weston would get a second swimming pool and this was going to be built at Hutton Moor Leisure Centre - since then we've been met by silence.

At June's Full Council Meeting I quizzed the council about the second pool and was dismayed to learn that the last administration left behind no plans to build a second swimming pool. The last 4 years have been wasted.

Since June I've frequently met with Hutton Moor Leisure Centre and the councillor responsible for leisure and pressed for North Somerset Council to bring forward a leisure strategy that includes details of how a second pool can be delivered, and put this out for public consultation.

I'm determined to ensure Weston gets a second pool that we are all asking for, and I will keep campaigning for this!
